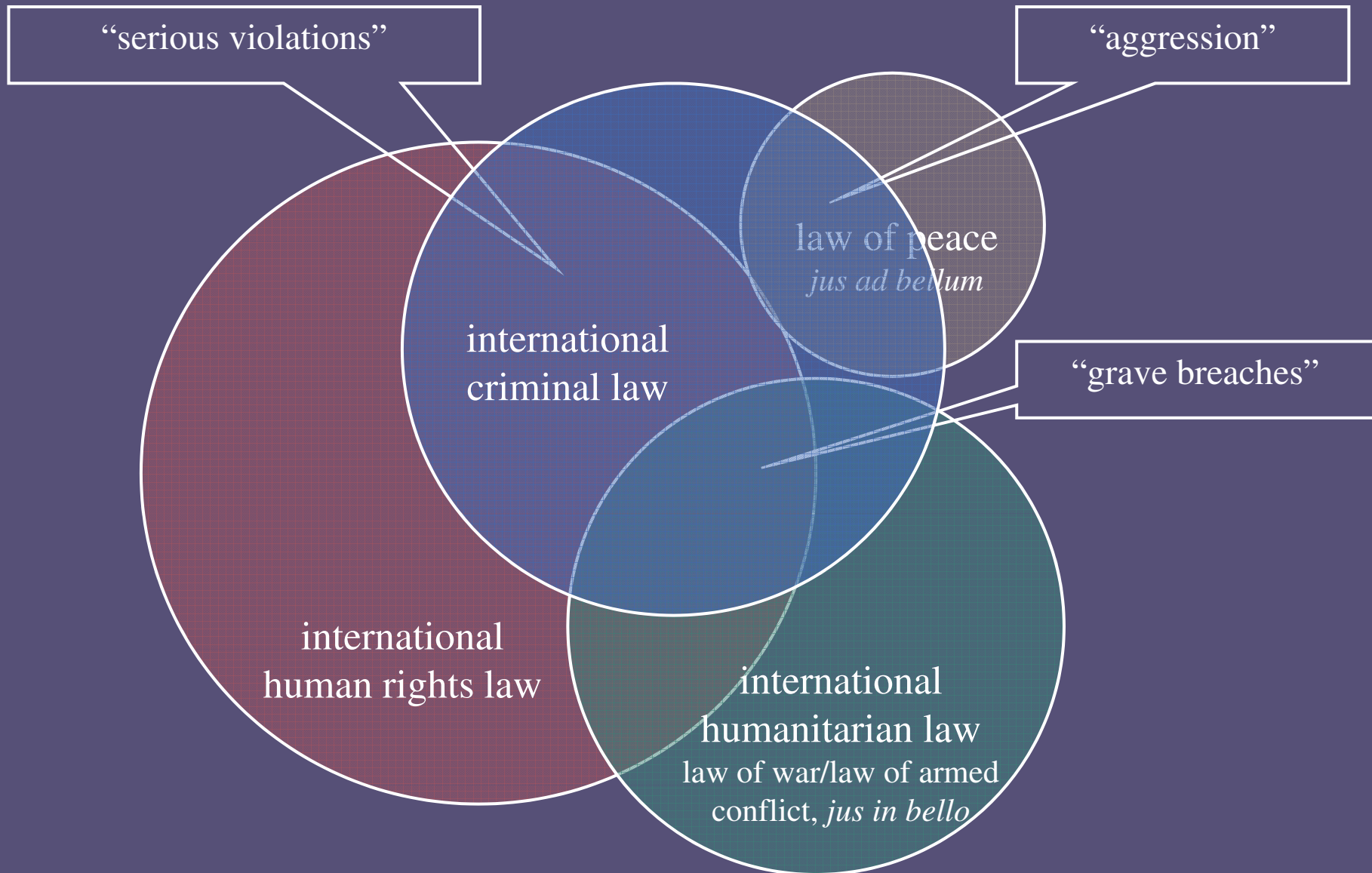

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# Interrelated spheres of international law

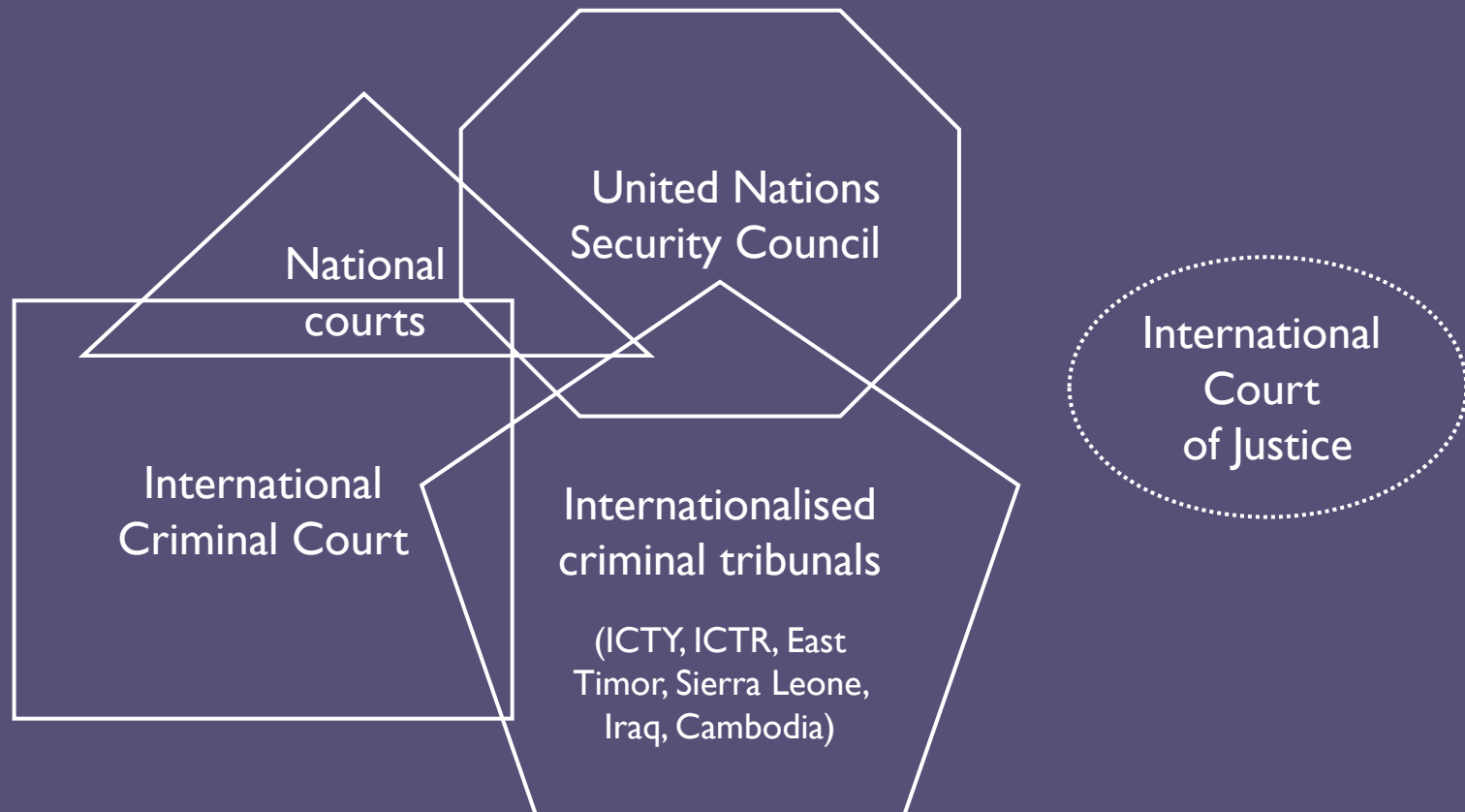


# System of international criminal justice

Key questions: WHAT, WHO, WHEN, & WHERE?

Boundaries of jurisdiction:

- *ratione materiae* (what?)
- *ratione personae* (who?)
- *ratione temporis* (when?)
- *ratione loci* (where?)

Created in July 1998 with the signature of the Rome Statute

3. Professional capacity

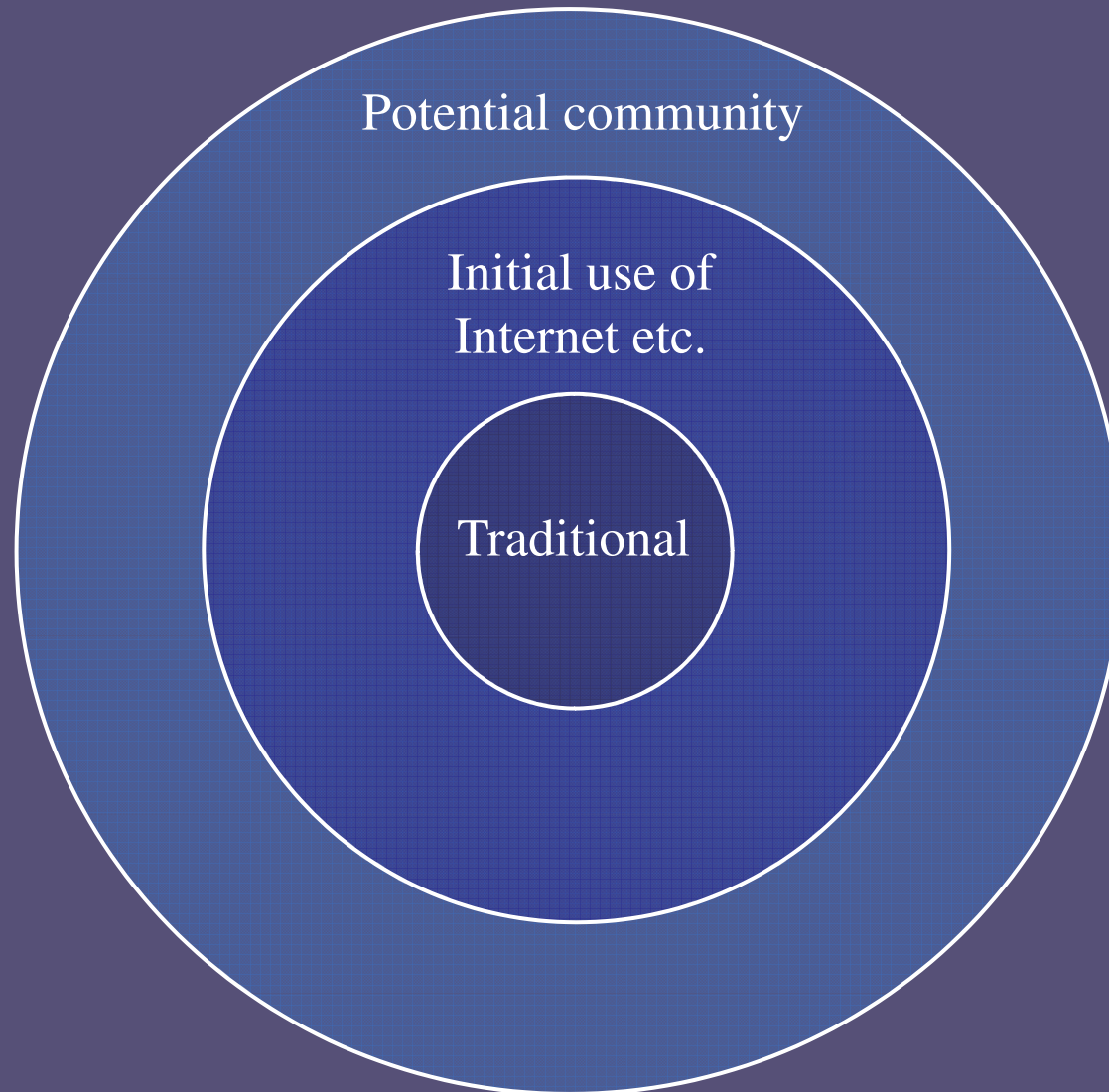
# Some prerequisites for professional capacity
