# THE KOSOVO ADVISORY OPINION: Self-Determination, Secession, and Other Unanswered Questions

On 22 July 2010, the International Court of Justice issued its longawaited Advisory Opinion on Kosovo's unilateral declaration of independence from Serbia. This panel discussion will consider the opinion and what it does – and does not – mean for the norm of selfdetermination, other groups aspiring to secession, and the role of international law and institutions in such highly politicised situations.

**Professor SORNARAJAH** is CJ Koh Professor of Law at the National University of Singapore. He has taught courses on International Commercial Arbitration, Foreign Investment Arbitration, International Investment Law and Public International Law at leading universities in the United States, United Kingdom, Australia, China and Sri Lanka. He is also the Tunku Abdul Rahman Professor of International Law at the University of Malaya. He is admitted to practice law in England and Wales, Singapore and Sri Lanka. He is on the Regional Panel of the Singapore International Arbitration. Professor Sornarajah specialises in settlement of disputes arising from foreign investment.


