How likely will your organization join the new Asia regional cable protection committee? (Most Likely / Likely / May be)




How soon this new Asia regional cable protection committee needs to be formed?

A SURVEY ON A NEW REGIONAL CABLE PROTECTION COMMITTEE (3/3)

Collaboration Among Cable Owners

- Sharing information on cable protection technologies, measures and experience
- Cause analysis of cable faults leading to cable protection recommendations
- Pooling of resources to provide a common chart database to mariners showing active cables and toll-free numbers
- Partnership with coastal States to create protection zones and sharing of AIS for monitoring and enforcement

Collaboration with Governments

- Cable repair arrangement
- Dealing with Governments on O&M matters
- Each country's regulation regarding laying, burying, repairing and protecting cables
- Cable protection legislation to relevant Government bodies
- Dealing with Governments on restrictions imposed by Governments on installation and repair operations
- Need to form a protection zone with the legal entity
