## **TERMS OF THE INTERNSHIP**

- The Intern will be employed as a Student Research Assistant by CIL and will be paid in accordance with the normal rate for student research assistants under NUS Regulations;
- CIL will provide funding for their travel between Geneva and Singapore, travel insurance, and a very modest subsidy for accommodation in Geneva;
- The Intern will be responsible for finding his or her own accommodation in Geneva;
- The Internship is open to current Law 3 and Law 4 students from the NUS Faculty of Law. Students with international law mooting experience are encouraged to apply;
- Because one of the objectives of CIL is to create opportunities for young Singaporean students to learn about careers in international law, the internship is open only to Singapore citizens or permanent residents.
