INTRODUCTION

Judge Rüdiger Wolfrum will present and explain the most recent Judgment of the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea from March 14, 2012 on the 'Dispute concerning delimitation of the maritime boundary between Bangladesh and Myanmar in the Bay of Bengal (Bangladesh/Myanmar). He will particularly deal with questions of jurisdiction (it should be noted that this is the first judgment delimiting entitlements to the continental shelf beyond 200 nautical miles), the treatment of islands in the delimitation process, the delimitation methodology and construction the of an adjusted equidistance line. This Judgment breaks new ground although it remains firmly within the parameters established to date by international courts and tribunals.
