




## **Arctic Sea Ice Extent**




1981-2010





# Singapore's Interests in the Arctic

Environmental Protection

- Development of A Safe Arctic Region
- Sustainable Economic Development

## Singapore's Engagement in the Arctic

- Participating at various Arctic forums and conferences;
- Conducting diplomatic-level visits and meetings;
- Attending Arctic Council meetings;
- Participating in the work of the AC Working Groups;
- Engaging in activities at the UN, IMO or other international bodies that shape the rules applicable to the Arctic;
- Initiating bilateral co-operation with Arctic States or Permanent Participants;





# **The Way Forward**

- Understand the situation in the Arctic in all its aspects and develop an Arctic Strategy;
- Engage in the work of various Arctic Council subsidiary bodies, propose and contribute to projects;
- Future co-operation areas may cover shipping, ship and rigger building, satellite position and survey, port facilities construction, and capacity training for search & rescue and oil pollution response, etc.;
- Develop international rules and standards to improve safe shipping in the Arctic;
