#### PRINCE CONSORT BANK

7°53'47.87"N, 109°58'28.53"E

#### Geographic area

Prince Consort Bank, a collection of submerged oceanic coral platforms in the southwestern part of the Spratlys, may have once been located on an atoll with a lagoon. It is just over 200NM southeast of the coastline of mainland Vietnam and over 300NM southwest and northwest of the islands of Palawan and Borneo, respectively. There is no shallow geographic feature nearby. The closest coral formations are deeper (yet visible): Prince of Wales Bank and Grainger Bank, 26NM and 28-30NM northeast and east, respectively. Prince Consort Bank extends close to 20km along its north-south axis and over 14km over its west-east axis.

Land area above water There are no visible above-water land areas on this bank.

## **Human** Two offshoinfrastructure structures

Two offshore connected by a 30m-long bridge are visible on the southern part of this bank when zooming in on high resolution satellite imagery. A helipad can be observed on the top of each of them.

#### Intertidal and submerged area

The total aerial coverage of the visible coral platforms is 9.53km². The bank is too deep to reliably derive bathymetry

from the satellite data


