

Research Position on Regulation of Shipping and Protection of the Marine Environment

The Centre for International Law (CIL) at the National University of Singapore (NUS) has a research grant from the Singapore Maritime Institute to conduct research on issues relating to the international regulation of shipping and governance of the marine environment. This grant supplements CIL's programme in Oceans Law and Policy. Research under the focusses on issues of interest to Singapore including: (i) the regulation on navigation in the straits used for international navigation; (ii) the governance of shipping in the Arctic; and (iii) governance of the marine environment, including the marine environment in areas beyond national jurisdiction.

CIL is seeking to recruit a full-time researcher under this grant. Candidates must have an undergraduate degree in law. Candidates with an LL.M. or PhD and/or prior work experience of between 2 to 5 years in maritime law, law of the sea, or international environmental law will be preferred. Preference will be given to candidates who are citizens or permanent residents of Singapore. The successful applicant would be expected to take up the position by 1 September 2018.
