1 March 2014: Phl asks neighbors to join case vs China

The Philippines yesterday called on Malaysia, Vietnam and other claimants to join its legal challenge to China's massive territorial claim in the South China Sea. Solicitor General Francis Jardeleza said Malaysia, Vietnam and two other governments could either take part in the Philippine case or file their own complaints against China.

10 February 2014: U.S., China trade accusations over South China Sea disputes

China rejected U.S. allegations that it is using vague territorial claims to gradually assert control in the disputed South China Sea, and in turn accused Washington of exaggerating tensions in the region. Foreign Ministry spokesman Hong Lei urged the U.S. to take a "rational and fair

attitude," and reiterated China's position that its claims are based on history and international law. In a statement Saturday, Hong said that some U.S. officials' remarks were not constructive, and "playing up tensions" was not conducive to maintaining peace and stability.

8 February 2014: China says US "irresponsible" over South China Sea defense zone

The Chinese government said on Friday that some US officials are "extremely irresponsible" to accuse China over a so-called plan to set up an Air Defense Identification Zone (ADIZ) over the South China Sea, state-run Xinhua News Agency reported. "Some US diplomats have made groundless accusations against China without verifying the claim," Foreign Ministry spokesman Hong Lei was quoted as tellig at a press briefing in Beijing.

6 February 2014: US presses Beijing on South China Sea claims

Danny Russel, the US assistant secretary of state for East Asian and Pacific affairs, said that maritime claims under international law needed to be based on land features. "Any Chinese claim to maritime rights not based on claimed land features would be inconsistent with international law," Russel told a congressional committee. "China could highlight its respect for international law by clarifying or adjusting its claim to bring it into accordance with international law of the sea," he said. Russel supported the Philippines' right to take its case to a United Nations tribunal - a move last year that was denounced by China - as part of efforts to find a "peaceful, non-coercive" solution.
