30 May 2020: China's first homegrown aircraft carrier conducting sea trials

China's Defense Ministry said the navy's only entirely home-built aircraft is carrying out sea trials to test weapons and equipment and enhance training of the crew. Ministry spokesperson Ren Guoqiang said Friday the exercises were being conducted as planned, apparently unaffected by the country's coronavirus outbreak.

The map reflects China's so-called "nine-dash line" in the South China Sea, according to the post.

18 May 2020: Discover China: South China islanders guard whales' "dining hall"

As the tide was still on the ebb at 6 a.m. on Weizhou Island in south China, Chen Mo, a marine biologist, got up, donned a wetsuit and grabbed his sampling tools, rushing to the intertidal zone of the islet's northern coast. At 7:10 a.m., Chen set foot in the shoal, sporting a waterproof camera. "The best time to search for any kind of marine organisms in the intertidal zone is about an hour before the low tide," he said. His research on the marine biodiversity of Weizhou is part of the fundamental works to help conserve Bryde's whales, a member of the baleen whale family that has been recently spotted off Weizhou after decades of absence.

18 May 2020: No indication China able to establish South China Sea ADIZ

China has previously declared its intention to establish an ADIZ in the disputed South China Sea, which it claims as part of its territory, Lieutenant General Ye Gou-huei (葉國輝), in charge of military operations and planning at the Ministry of National Defense (MND), said at a Legislative session. However, there is no indication Beijing is able to do so, he said, emphasizing that China would have to consider a number of factors before seeking to establish an ADIZ.

5 May 2020: China Coast Guard Increases Presence at Scarborough Shoal

The China Coast Guard deployed three ships to the Scarborough Shoal on Tuesday, days after China announced a ban on fishing there and at other disputed parts of the South China Sea, ship-tracking software shows. Scarborough Shoal is contested by China and the Philippines. While it is not uncommon for China Coast Guard (CCG) ships to patrol near disputed islands and reefs, the simultaneous presence of three CCG ships at one location often coincides with a more intense pressure campaign or providing an escort for another Chinese mission at sea.

5 May 2020: China to set up ADIZ in South China Sea

The Ministry of National Defense (MND) on Monday morning (May 4) confirmed that China is planning to set up an air defense identification zone (ADIZ) in the South China Sea. An ADIZ is a country's airspace in which all civilian aircraft must identify themselves and announce their location. The MND clarified Monday night that although China has stated that it would establish an ADIZ in the South China Sea, it has yet to formally announce one. The Philippines' ADIZ is currently the only designated airspace in the disputed region, CNA reported.

3 May 2020: Beijing says it opposes 'countries from outside the region' bolstering naval presence in South China Sea

China's Ministry of National Defense (MND) said on 30 April that it opposes what it referred to as "countries from outside the region" bolstering their naval presence in the South China Sea (SCS), as the US Navy (USN) continues to carry out freedom-of-

navigation operations (FONOPs) and joint exercises with allied navies in the disputed waters.Referring to joint manoeuvres conducted earlier in April by the USN and the Royal Australian Navy (RAN), MND spokesperson Senior Colonel Wu Qian said that such actions are "detrimental to peace and stability in the region", and described the United States as "a troublemaker" and "the biggest facilitator of the militarisation of the South China Sea".

3 May 2020: China plays divide and rule in South China Sea

On April 20, an intruding Vietnamese fishing boat capsized and sank with the loss of four lives after repeatedly trying to ram an Indonesian patrol craft. Two other Vietnamese vessels and their crews were detained in the encounter west of the Natuna Islands. The incident had not been made public for a week as the two Southeast Asian neighbors sought to smooth the situation through diplomatic channels.

01 May 2020: Summer fishing ban starts in South China Sea

The summer fishing moratorium started Friday noon in the waters north to 12 degrees north latitude of the South China Sea, with the coast guard and fishery authorities launching law enforcement work. The annual fishing ban this year is expected to end at noon on Aug. 16. More than 50,000 fishing boats will suspend operations during the three-and-a-half-month moratorium, according to the South China Sea branch of China Coast Guard.

21 May 2020: US warns India of China 'aggression' at border, likens situation to South China Sea

The United States on Wednesday (May 20) accused China of employing border clashes with India to try to shift the status quo, and encouraged New Delhi to resist. Alice Wells, the top US diplomat for South Asia, drew parallels between the growing skirmishes in the Himalayas and Beijing's years of increasing assertiveness in the dispute-rife South China Sea. "For anyone who was under any illusions that Chinese aggression was only rhetorical, I think they need to speak to India," Wells told the Atlantic Council think tank. "If you look to the South China Sea, there's a method here to Chinese operations, and it is that constant aggression, the constant attempt to shift the norms, to shift what is the status quo. 20 May 2020: Pentagon says China's military is challenging the US with 'risky' runins in the South China Sea during the pandemic

The Pentagon said the US military has had "unsafe" encounters with the Chinese armed forces in the South China Sea during the COVID-19 pandemic, which is also a source of deepening tension between the two countries. There have been "at least nine" concerning incidents involving Chinese fighter jets and US aircraft in the skies above the contested waterway since mid-March, Reed Werner, the deputy assistant secretary of defense for Southeast Asia, told Fox News on Tuesday, adding that China continues to engage in "risky and escalatory behavior." 15 May 2020: Navy P-8 With Secretive Radar Pod Surveils Massive Chinese Naval Base in South China Sea

On May 15, 2020, online plane spotter and Twitter user Golf9 spotted the P-8A, which carries the Navy Bureau Number 169010, flying a route through the South China Sea that took it around Hainan and into the Gulf of Tonkin. The Poseidon then turned around and

exited the area along a similar path. A U.S. Navy ship conducted presence operations near Panamanian flagged drillship, West Capella, May 12. 8 May 2020: B-1s conduct training mission in South China Sea

A 9th Expeditionary Bomb Squadron B-1B Lancer takes off at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam, May 8, 2020. It was one of two B-1s conducting a training mission in the South China Sea in support of Pacific Air Forces' training efforts and strategic deterrence missions to reinforce the rules-based international order in the Indo-Pacific region. The 9th EBS is deployed from the 7th Bomb Wing, Dyess AFB, Texas. This is the first BTF deployment to the PACAF theater since the B-2 Spirit from the 393rd Bomb Squadron, Whiteman AFB, Missouri, deployed to Hawaii in January 2019.

8 May 2020: U.S. Sends Warships on Patrol Near South China Sea Standoff

The U.S. Navy sent a pair of ships to patrol in the vicinity of a mineral rights dispute between Malaysia and China in the South China Sea for the second time in a month, U.S. officials told USNI News. Littoral Combat Ship USS Montgomery (LCS-8) and replenishment ship USNS Cesar Chavez (T-AKE-14) conducted a presence operation in the South China Sea on Thursday near Panamanian-flagged drill ship West Capella. The drill ship is under contract to conduct surveying operations in Malaysia's exclusive economic zone for Malaysian state oil company Petronas. Chinese People Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) warships and China Coast Guard vessels have also operated near the Malaysian-contracted drilling ship.

4 May 2020: Defense Secretary Mark Esper says China continuing 'provocations' in disputed South China Sea

About a week after Chinese officials claimed they expelled an American Navy destroyer from disputed waters in the South China Sea, the U.S. Department of Defense is continuing to track "very aggressive" behavior from naval and air units of the People's Liberation Army. During an online discussion sponsored by the Washington, D.C.-based Brookings Institution, Secretary of Defense Mark T. Esper on Monday said Beijing has not been consistent in how it follows international maritime norms. 3 May 2020: US deploys heavy bombers, hundreds of airmen to Guam to 'Deter China'

The deployment comes following the quiet withdrawal of five B-52 nuclear-capable Stratofortress bombers from Guam to the US mainland in mid-April, which temporarily froze the Pentagon's 16-year-long 'Continuous Bomber Presence' mission on the Pacific island.
