Ambassador Mahmoud Daifallah Hmoud is the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to the Republic of Singapore since April 2018, and the Non-Resident Ambassador to the Socialist Republic of Vietnam. He has an extensive career in the Jordanian foreign service, and previously served as the Legal Advisor of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates of Jordan for several terms (1999-2001, 2006-2009, 2013, 2016-2018). Ambassador Hmoud was also appointed the Deputy Permanent Representative at the Jordan Permanent Mission to the

United Nations during Jordan's membership of the United Nations Security Council (2014-2015), in charge of Security Council affairs. He also served as the Deputy Chief of Mission at the Jordan Embassy to Washington, DC (2009-2013).

During his career, Ambassador Hmoud negotiated several bilateral and multilateral agreements on behalf of Jordan and represented Jordan in regional and international meetings. Furthermore, Ambassador Hmoud advised the Jordanian Government on legal matters relating to Jordan's foreign policy and international relations, including the Middle East peace process, UN affairs, accession to the WTO, foreign investment and energy-related matters. Moreover, he acted as counsel for the Jordanian Government in proceedings before international tribunals, including the International Court of Justice and the International Criminal Court. Since 2007, Ambassador Hmoud has been a member of the UN International law Commission and served on its Bureau.

Ambassador Hmoud has several publications on legal and foreign policy matters and lectured at academic institutions and other fora worldwide. He has Jordan's Istiklal (Independence) medal of the First Order. Ambassador Hmoud has a Master of Laws (LLM) degree in International and Comparative Law from the George Washington University, and a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of Jordan.

He is married to Mrs. Kirsty Reid Hmoud and has two children.
