30 December 2020: Suspected Chinese underwater drone caught by Indonesian fisherman

The fisherman apparently hauled up the drone last Sunday (Dec. 20) near the Selayar Islands, an Indonesian archipelago in the South Sulawesi province, according to Naval News. He then turned it over to the local police, who then handed it over to the Indonesian military. According to Indonesian outlet detikNews, the unmanned underwater vehicle (UUV) measures 225 centimeters in length, with a 50 cm wingspan, an 18-cm-long tail, and a 93-cm-long trailing antenna. Indonesian based security and defense poster @Jatosint pointed out its similarities to the Chinese Sea Wing UUV, made by the state-run Chinese Academy of Sciences' Shenyang Institute of Automation. https://www.taiwannews.com.tw/en/news/4090128

24 December 2020: China sends second ship to trial amid rising tensions in South China Sea

China's navy has started trials on its second trademark warship as tensions between the Communist nation and the US continue to rise in the fiercely contested South China Sea. The People's Liberation Army has ordered a total of eight Type 075 assault ships, which are capable of carrying 30 attack helicopters and 900 troops, according to a Newsweek report. 22 December 2020: Chinese military says it "expelled" US naval ship from South China Sea

China's military on Tuesday claimed to have "expelled" a US Navy destroyer which sailed through the disputed South China Sea challenging Beijing's claims over the area. US naval ships regularly sail through the disputed South China Sea (SCS) in a bid to assert freedom of navigation in the region. China claims almost all of the 1.3 million square mile South China Sea as its sovereign territory. China has been building military bases on artificial islands in the region also claimed by Brunei, Malaysia, the Philippines, Taiwan and Vietnam.

21 December 2020: South China Sea: PLA's new dry dock in Hainan big enough for Type 002 aircraft carriers, analysts say

A dry dock being built at China's naval complex on the island province of Hainan in the South China Sea will be big enough to accommodate the country's new generation of aircraft carriers, military analysts say. Satellite images found this month via the Earth Explorer website show the facility under construction at the Yulin Naval Base in Sanya, where China's first domestically developed aircraft carrier, the Shandong, was commissioned in December last year.

17 December 2020: Beijing Upgrading Naval Bases To Strengthen Grip On South China Sea

A few days ago the Chinese Navy, formally known as the PLAN (People's Liberation army Navy), conducted a live fire exercise over the South China Sea. Harbin Z-9 helicopters took off from a base at Sanya on the southern tip of Hainan and fired anti-ship missiles at simulated targets. The Z-9, a license built variant of the Eurocopter AS365 Dauphin, is a standard shipboard helicopter of the PLAN. The exercise itself sends a signal, but more critical is the base where they took off. That has been massively improved over the past year.

15 December 2020: Philippines, Japan affirm close cooperation over South China Sea

President Rodrigo Duterte and Japanese Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga agreed Monday to closely cooperate over issues related to the South China Sea, the Japanese Foreign Ministry said, as Beijing continues its military buildup in the waters despite the concerns of neighboring countries. During their 20-minute telephone conversation, Suga voiced eagerness to further develop the strategic partnership between Japan and the Philippines and work together to realize a "free and open Indo-Pacific," the ministry said.

12 December 2020: Maritime rescue drill held in South China Sea

4 December 2020: Vietnam condemns China, Taiwan's "illegal" acts in South China Sea

Vietnam on Thursday condemned China and Taiwan's recent "illegal excursion", including operating tourist cruises and organising live fire drills, into its rightful waters in the South China Sea. Spokesperson for the foreign ministry Lê Thị Thu Hằng during a press briefing in Hanoi said that Chinese Taipei's holding of military live ammunition exercises around the Ba Bình (Taiping) island on November 24 as part of Việt Nam's Trường Sa (Spratly) archipelago constituted a "grave violation of Vietnamese territory, sovereign rights."

3 December 2020: Taiwan's Ocean Affairs Council can order counterattack in South China Sea

If Taiwanese ships are attacked near disputed South China Sea islands, the right to order return fire lies with the head of the Cabinet-level Ocean Affairs Council (OAC), reports said Thursday. In the event that communication is cut off between Taiwan and the Pratas islands or Itu Aba Island, the highest-ranking local officer can also make the decision to fire back at assailants, UDN reported. The changes were made to regulations Wednesday during the OAC's review of proposals made in June. 2 December 2020: New PLAN hospital ship deploys to the South China Sea

China's People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) commissioned a new 4,000-tonne hospital ship on 30 November for service in the South China Sea, state-owned broadcaster China Central Television (CCTV) reported the following day. Named Nanyi 13, it is one of two vessels of a new class built at the Rongcheng Shidao shipyard near Weihai on the Yellow Sea coast. Nanyi 12 was launched in November 2017 and Nanyi 13 in March 2018.

25 December 2020: John S. McCain conducts Christmas Eve FONOP in South China Sea

The U.S. Navy warship John S. McCain conducted a freedom of navigation operation, or FONOP, Christmas Eve in the South China Sea, its second such operation this week. The guided-missile destroyer "asserted navigational rights and freedoms near Vietnam in the vicinity of the Con Dao Island in the South China Sea" on Thursday, according to the Japan-based U.S. 7th Fleet. "The ship conducted normal operations within Vietnam's claimed territorial seas to challenge excessive maritime claims and preserve access and navigational freedoms consistent with international law," the command said in a statement.

3 December 2020: US plans to restore Navy's 1st Fleet in rebuff to China in South China Sea

US President Donald Trump's administration is seeking to finalise a build-up in the US Navy's presence in vital Pacific and Indian Ocean seaways to Australia's north, to ward off any further expansion of China's interests. With only seven weeks left in power, the President's Naval Secretary, Kenneth Braithwaite, announced he would reform the Navy's 1st Fleet for the first time in more than four decades. The fleet will dedicate more American ships and sailors to waters off South-East Asia and west to the Indian Ocean, including the Strait of Malacca through which much of the region's oil and cargo supplies transit by sea.
