Steven Solomon is Principal Legal Officer at the World Health Organization in Geneva. He heads the Legal Office's unit on international, constitutional and global health law, where, in addition to providing legal support for the organization's response to the covid-19 outbreak, he focuses on normative global health matters, including the International Health Regulations, the Framework Convention on Tobacco Control and the Pandemic influenza preparedness Framework. Prior to joining WHO, Steven served as deputy legal counselor at the United States Mission to United Nations Organizations in Geneva, negotiating a variety of human rights and humanitarian law instruments. He was an attorney with the US State Department for before that, where he was participant in negotiations related to anti-personnel landmines and the International Criminal Court. Steven Solomon came to the State Department from private practice with Williams & Connolly in Washington D.C.

Solomon received his legal degree from Georgetown, and his BA from Columbia University.
