29 March 2021: Wary of Beijing, Taiwan Doubles Down on South China Sea Island

24 March 2021: South China Sea: Beijing has extended another Spratly Islands reef, photos show

China has reclaimed land to extend a reef in the Spratly Islands, in the disputed South China Sea, satellite images show. Photographs taken by American space technology company Maxar showed that Subi Reef — which is also claimed by the Philippines and Vietnam — had new land added to it that had not been visible in a satellite photo taken on February 20. The new rectangle of land, about 2.85 hectares (7 acres) in size, had been added to the southern edge of the ring-shaped coral atoll, which encloses a lagoon and has a channel for vessels to enter and leave.

12 March 2021: Taiwan nabs smuggled cigarettes near disputed South China Sea island

The Coast Guard Administration (CGA) found 1.63 million packs of smuggled cigarettes with a street value of more than NT\$100 million (US\$3.54 million) on a ship near the disputed Pratas Islands in the South China Sea, reports said Friday (March 12). The catch, just west of the islands, was made on a Togolese-registered freighter on March 6, CNA reported. The cigarettes are suspected to be counterfeit Chinese brands.

4 March 2021: Hainan to create a genebank for the conservation of biodiversity in the South China Sea

China's Hainan began building a germplasm storage facility to conserve biodiversity in the South China Sea. According to the Hainan Daily, the gene bank of flora and fauna will be finally formed by 2023. The total investment in this project reaches 22 million yuan (about \$ 3.4 million). Experts have already set out on scientific expeditions to collect biological samples in the coastal waters of Hainan and the evergreen mangrove forests that grow in the island's tidal strip. In the future, the expedition will be equipped for deep-sea research.

11 March 2021: Resolutions introduced in US to condemn China's actions in South China Sea

Influential US Senators have introduced a slew of resolutions in the Senate, condemning China's rising actions to militarise the South China Sea and also to tackle Beijing's economic practices that distort global markets and hurt the American businesses.

Introduced by Senators Rick Scott, Josh Hawley, Dan Sullivan, Thom Tillis and Roger Wicker on Wednesday, the first resolution applauded the American Navy and Coast Guard for their efforts to ensure freedom of navigation operations and send a clear message that the US will not tolerate Communist China's extension of power in waters beyond its legitimate territorial sea boundaries.

10 March 2021: 'Quad' leaders meet: PM Modi to meet US president Joe Biden virtually on 12 March

Prime Minister Narendra Modi agreed with his Japanese counterpart Yoshihide Suga on Tuesday to boost bilateral cooperation and also strengthen ties through the India, Japan, US, and Australia grouping for a free and open Indo-Pacific. The talks between Modi and Suga came ahead of a summit of the leaders of the Quad nations, a grouping of the US, India, Australia and Japan, which support a free and open Indo-Pacific. The talks will be held on Friday as part of the focus of the administration of US President Joe Biden on reinforcing the group and countering China.

5 March 2021: India-Philippines BrahMos pact: A deal that sends message to China India has taken a major step towards becoming an arms exporter. India has signed a key pact with the Philippines for the sale of "defence material and equipment", which are likely to include BrahMos cruise missiles. This is a significant development for two reasons. 3 March 2021: Beijing to Berlin: respect South China Sea sovereignty during frigate visit

Beijing has called on Germany not to infringe on the sovereignty of South China Sea claimants, in response to Berlin's plans to send a frigate to the region in August. Chinese foreign ministry spokesman Wang Wenbin said on Wednesday that all countries enjoyed freedom of navigation and overflight in the South China Sea, but "this should not be used as an excuse to endanger the sovereignty and security of littoral countries".

3 March 2021: German warship to sail through South China Sea, officials say

A German frigate will set sail for Asia in August and, on its return journey, become the first German warship to cross the South China Sea since 2002, senior government officials in Berlin said on Tuesday (March 2). The ship will not pass within what officials called the "12-nautical-mile", officials in the foreign and defence ministries added, in a reference to contested areas in the crowded sea.
