29 April 2021: South China Sea: Taiwan unveils coastguard vessel that doubles as warship

Taiwan has commissioned the first of a fleet of coastguard ships that can be converted into warships to bolster defence of Taipei-controlled islands in the South China Sea, amid growing threats from mainland China. Delivery of the new 5,000-tonne patrol vessel Chiayi – Taiwan's largest – to the island's coastguard, along with the launch of another similar frigate on Thursday, came two weeks after the Taiwanese navy launched its first modern amphibious assault and transport vessel, Yushan, to meet its needs in the disputed waters.

28 April 2021: China urges PH: Respect our sovereignty and rights, stop drills in South China Sea

26 April 2021: Vietnam, China defence ministers meet amid South China Sea tensions

Chinese Defence Minister Wei Fenghe and his Vietnamese counterpart Phan Van Giang strengthened the two nations' military cooperation and discussed tensions in the South China Sea during a three-day visit to Hanoi. Wei, who is visiting Hanoi from April 24-27, said in closed-door meetings on Sunday that cooperation on defence between the two nations remained vital to securing peace and stability in the region, the Vietnamese Defence Ministry said in a statement late on Sunday.

25 April 2021: EU should 'stop sowing discord' in South China Sea: Chinese spokesperson

Security risks in the South China Sea mainly come from outside the region, a spokesperson of the Chinese Mission to the European Union (EU) said Saturday, urging the EU to stop sowing discord. "The South China Sea should not become a tool for certain countries to contain and suppress China, still less a wrestling ground for major-power rivalry," said the spokesperson. The comments came in response to a statement issued by the European External Action Service (EEAS) earlier Saturday. The EU's diplomatic service claimed that tensions in the region, "including the recent presence of large Chinese vessels at Whitsun Reef," endanger peace and stability.

23 April 2021: Japan to hold 1st large-scale military drills with US and France amid South China Sea tensions

The exercise will start in the south of Japan from May 11, marking the first time the three nations will have held a drill with ground troops, as tensions simmer with Beijing over activity in the East and South China Seas. The announcement of the joint exercise was made by the Japanese Ground Self-Defense Force (JGSDF) and the defense minister on Friday, as the nation aims to strengthen its military cooperation with allies in the region. "By strengthening cooperation between Japan, the United States and France, we'd like to further improve the tactics and skills of the Self-Defense Forces in defending remote island territories," Defense Minister Nobuo Kishi said, in an apparent jab at China's claim over islands in the East and South China Seas.

14 April 2021: China Trademarked Hundreds of South China Sea Landmarks

Not content with claiming sovereignty over nearly every crag of rock and spit of sand in the South China Sea, China has taken the unusual step of registering trademarks over hundreds of land features scattered throughout those disputed waters, a BenarNews investigation has found. That action is meeting with disapproval from other South China Sea claimants. Taiwan and Vietnam have rejected the legitimacy of the trademarks, which experts described as a possible attempt by the People's Republic of China to control how domestic and even foreign companies use South China Sea branding.

13 April 2021: Officials: the Philippines Expanding South China Sea Patrols Near Disputed Reef

The Philippines has sent additional ships on Tuesday to its maritime territory that is subject to China's expansive claims in the South China Sea, officials announced on Tuesday. The Task Force-West under the National Task Force for the West Philippine Sea deployed another Coast Guard cutter, four Navy ships and two other vessels from the Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources to the South China Sea and Kalayaan Island Group (KIG), where Whitsun Reef is located, for maritime patrol.

This is just the latest instance of the Chinese government leveraging civilian assets to pursue its national security interests in the South China Sea, a common practice under China's strategy of "military-civil fusion."

9 April 2021: Chinese scientists drill in contested South China Sea amid rising tensions

Chinese scientists have carried out deep-sea drilling in the disputed South China Sea to obtain sediment core, according to state media, a move that is expected to fuel tensions in the region. They retrieved the sediment core – measuring 231 metres (758 feet) – using a Chinese-made drilling system, the "Sea Bull II", on Wednesday. It was taken from a depth of 2,060 metres (6,758 feet) in an unknown location of the waterway, state news agency Xinhua reported on Thursday.

7 April 2021: Taiwan says may shoot down Chinese drones in South China Sea

Taiwan has spotted Chinese drones circling the Taipei-controlled Pratas Islands in the South China Sea and may shoot them down if they stray too close, a government minister said on Wednesday, a move that could dramatically increase tensions with Beijing. Speaking at parliament, Lee Chung-wei, who heads the Ocean Affairs Council under whose purview the Coast Guard falls, said that they had recently spotted Chinese drones

circling the Pratas, though they have not flown over the islands. "They have never entered our restricted waters and airspace, they've just flown around them at a certain distance," Lee said. "After it enters it will be handled under the rules. If we need to open fire, we open fire."

6 April 2021: Chinese aircraft carrier holds drills near Taiwan as US carrier steams into South China Sea

A Chinese carrier group drilled in waters off Taiwan as a U.S. carrier group entered the South China Sea amid rising tensions over China's refusal to call back dozens of ships from the Philippines' exclusive economic zone (EEZ). China's first aircraft carrier, the Liaoning, accompanied by five other People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) vessels, steamed through the Miyako Strait toward the Pacific Saturday (April 3) to conduct "regular exercises" near Taiwan. Meanwhile, Nimitz-class supercarrier the USS Theodore Roosevelt and its strike group (TRCSG) returned to the South China Sea Sunday (April 4).

5 April 2021: Philippines and China intensify war of words over South China Sea

The Philippines on Monday accused Beijing of promoting a "false narrative" of its "illegitimate" claims in the disputed South China Sea, marking Manila's latest move in a weekslong feud that has strained diplomatic ties. Philippine and Chinese embassy officials have been locked in a war of words since last month over the presence of nearly 200 Chinese ships which were first detected in the Whitsun Reef before spreading out to other areas in the disputed waters.

28 April 2021: Vietnamese Foreign Minister Pledges Deeper Cooperation with Japan

Yesterday, Vietnam's newly appointed Foreign Minister Bui Thanh Son spoke on the phone with his Japanese counterpart Motegi Toshimitsu, during which the pair flagged areas of common interest and pledged to advance their nations' strategic partnership. As per the coverage in Vietnamese state media, the topic of the discussion between the two close partners was relatively anodyne, ranging from COVID-19 cooperation to trade and

investment. According to the media paraphrase, Son said that Vietnam considers Japan "a long-term strategic partner of utmost importance and wants to bolster cooperation with the country." Notably (and unsurprisingly), the ministers "also exchanged views on international and regional matters of shared concern, including East Sea issues," as Vietnam refers to the disputes in the South China Sea. Recent weeks have been marked by tensions between China and the Philippines in disputed parts of the Spratly Islands, due to Beijing's deployment of an intimidating flotilla of maritime militia vessels around Philippine-occupied features.
