



Prof. Romel Regalado Bagares, a trustee of the Philippine Society of International Law (PSIL), teaches international law courses at the Lyceum of the Philippines University College of Law and the San Sebastian College Recoletos Manila Graduate School of Law LLM Program. He litigated before the Supreme Court two landmark cases on the application of the Law of the Sea in Philippine law, namely *Magallona v Executive Secretary* (2011) and *Republic v Palawan* (2019). He has communication and law degrees from the University of the Philippines and a master's degree (*cum laude*) from the Free University Amsterdam. His most recent publications are an essay in a volume on the *History and Theory of Customary International Law* (forthcoming, Cambridge University Press, 2021) and the Philippine Chapter for the *Oxford Handbook on International Law in Asia and the Pacific* (Oxford University Press, 2019). A third essay, on 'Pedagogical Pitfalls: the Philippine National Territorial Imaginary after the 2016 South China Sea Arbitral Award', is forthcoming with the British Institute of International Law and Comparative Law (BIICL, 2022).
