Article 123 of UNCLOS provides that states bordering semi-enclosed seas should co-operate with each other in the exercise of their rights and in the page 3/4 performance of their duties under this Convention. In this session, speakers will discuss how the obligation under Art.123 UNCLOS has been interpreted in case law and publications, as well as best practices in other regions. Furthermore, the session will discuss how to enhance cooperation between Southeast Asia countries in (i) maritime scientific research; (ii) exploration and exploitation of the living resources of the sea; and (iii) inviting other interested States or international organizations to cooperate in implementing the obligation under Article 123 of UNCLOS
