Mr Ong Chin Heng is Senior State Counsel in the International Affairs Division of the Attorney-General's Chambers of Singapore, where he has served since 2005. He holds a Bachelor of Laws (Hons) from the National University of Singapore, and a Master of Laws (majoring in international legal studies) from New York University. He is called to the Bar in Singapore and New York.

Mr Ong currently oversees the work of the International Economic Law practice group in his Division. He has handled numerous matters in this area of law, such as negotiating Singapore's FTAs with the European Union, China, the Eurasian Economic Union, the Comprehensive & Progressive Transpacific Partnership, and ASEAN; as well as several of Singapore's investment treaties.
