29 July 2022: US Navy Carrier Enters South China Sea Amid Taiwan Tensions

A US aircraft carrier and strike group have entered the South China Sea as part of what the 7th Fleet said was a scheduled operation amid rising tensions with China over a potential Taiwan visit by House Speaker Nancy Pelosi.

29 July 2022: CNOOC Finds Shale Oil in South China Sea Exploration Well

China's CNOOC Ltd has tapped commercial flows of oil and gas from a shale exploration well in the South China Sea, marking the first successfully drilled shale oil well offshore China, state media reported on Thursday. 29 July 2022: China announces series of exercises in S. China Sea as Taiwan issue raises tensions

In a show of military might China announced a series of almost-simultaneous exercises in the South China Sea between July 27 and 31, including rare live-fire drills only 125 kilometers (78 miles) from Taiwan, just as reports emerged that the U.S. House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi may embark on her Asia-Pacific tour on July 29.

24 July 2022: China stations permanent 'rescue forces' on Spratly artificial islands

China has placed permanent rescue forces and maritime authorities on its artificial islands in the South China Sea, according to state-owned China Central Television. Its flying squadron and maritime rescue and administration staff would be stationed at Fiery Cross, Subi and Mischief reefs in the Spratlys to boost rescue operations, says the media report. This would transform a regular on-call rescue ship deployment into a permanent institutional presence that could improve the coverage of the southern area of the disputed waterway, it added.

the waterway earlier this week. 20 July 2022: China holds 5-day military exercise in disputed South China Sea

China announced a large-scale military exercise in the South China Sea after an American aircraft carrier sailed near the contested Spratly Islands and a U.S. Navy destroyer conducted consecutive sail-throughs. The Hainan Maritime Safety Administration (MSA) issued a navigation warning on Friday, saying military drills would take place from Saturday to Wednesday in a large area overlapping the Paracel Islands, an archipelago contested by China, Taiwan and Vietnam but controlled entirely by China.

18 July 2022: 'Abusing China's restraint': Beijing accuses Australia of provocation at sea

China has accused Australia of provocation in the South China Sea and said Australia – along with the United States and Canada – must "refrain from abusing China's restraint". Foreign ministry spokesman Wang Wenbin was responding to a question about recent military encounters in the South China Sea, including reports in Politico that a Chinese fighter jet had an "unsafe" and "unprofessional" interaction with an American C-130 aircraft.

14 July 2022: China claims arbitral ruling on South China Sea 'seriously violates int'l law'

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin in a press conference on Wednesday said: "The so-called award of the South China Sea arbitration seriously violates international law including the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea. It is illegal, null, and void." He reiterated that China's position on the matter is "consistent and clear." "China neither accepts nor recognizes it and will never accept any claim or action based on the award. By doing so, we are upholding international rule of law," he added.

The United States regularly carries out what it calls Freedom of Navigation Operations in the South China Sea challenging what it says are restrictions on innocent passage imposed by China and other claimants.

Marcos, Jr. should veer away from his predecessor's foreign policy and assert the country's claims in the South China Sea, a coalition said on Monday, a day before the sixth anniversary of the Philippines' arbitral victory in its sea dispute with China. "If he decides to follow the Duterte administration's defeatist policy on China, and if he crumbles before Beijing's bullying and abandons our fisherfolk, the Filipino youth will make sure that he regrets it," the West Philippine Sea Coalition said in a statement.

4 July 2022: 12 bodies found after South China Sea typhoon shipwreck

Twelve bodies have been found following a shipwreck in the South China Sea over the weekend that left the crew of 30 missing, Chinese authorities said Monday. The announcement came days after an engineering vessel 160 nautical miles (296 kilometres) southwest of Hong Kong suffered substantial damage and broke into two pieces during a typhoon.

Jung Pak, deputy assistant secretary for East Asia at the State Department, told a U.S. think tank there was "a clear and

19 July 2022: USS Benfold Transits Taiwan Strait Following South China Sea Freedom of Navigation Ops

USS Benfold (DDG-65) transited the Taiwan Strait Tuesday, less than a week after its freedom of navigation operations in the South China Sea irked the Chinese government. Benfold's transit comes three days after it sailed near the Spratly Islands in the South China Sea as part of a freedom of navigation operation, U.S. 7th Fleet said in a press release last week. "This freedom of navigation operation ("FONOP") upheld the rights, freedoms, and lawful uses of the sea recognized in international law by challenging restrictions on innocent passage imposed by the People's Republic of China (PRC), Vietnam, and Taiwan," according to the 7th Fleet statement.

16 July 2022: US Navy ship again sails near disputed South China Sea islands

13 July 2022: US Navy destroyer performs freedom of navigation exercise in South China Sea

A US Navy destroyer sailed near a disputed South China Sea island chain on Wednesday, challenging the restrictions imposed by China and others on transit through the area. Lt. Nicholas Lingo, a spokesperson for the US Navy's 7th Fleet headquartered in Japan, said it was the second so-called freedom of navigation operation in the Paracel Islands -- known as the Xisha Islands in China -- so far this year, and the third targeting Beijing's "excessive maritime claims" in regional waters during the same period.
