30 August 2022: Chinese Hackers Tied to Attacks on South China Sea Energy Firms

Chinese hackers likely targeted energy companies operating in the South China Sea and the Australian government, according to a US tech security firm, the latest accusation of coordinated cybersnooping by the Asian nation to advance its geopolitical goals. Researchers uncovered an ongoing phishing campaign lasting more than a year that has been aimed at projects including the Kasawari gas field and a wind farm in the Taiwan Strait, Proofpoint Inc. said in a report on Tuesday. The gas project is in Malaysian waters and operated by Petroliam Nasional Bhd., which declined to comment on the research report.

30 August 2022: Chinese minister hopes Philippines will revive talks on oil, gas deals in South China Sea

A Chinese minister has expressed hope for the revival of talks with the Philippines on oil and gas exploration in the South China Sea, without undermining each other's claims in the disputed waterway. Liu Jianchao, head of the Communist Party's diplomatic arm, the International Liaison Department, told reporters in Manila last weekend that the discussions could continue if both sides showed "some kind of flexibility". "It seems that there are some legal barriers or legal factors that are standing in the way of a final consensus," said Liu, who previously served as the Chinese ambassador to the Philippines. "I hope that both sides will move about this issue in a way that is feasible and practical so that the cooperation could be continued and realised."

26 August 2022: China's aircraft carrier conducts combat drills with full battle group in South China Sea amid Taiwan tensions

A Chinese aircraft carrier, which raised eyebrows by undergoing overhaul and upgrades just over two years after its launch, held combat drills in the South China Sea with its full battle group, consisting of a flotilla of naval ships, including a nuclear submarine, as Beijing ratcheted tensions over Taiwan.

14 August 2022: Chinese customs seize thousands of maps over missing South China Sea 'nine-dash line'

Customs officials in China's eastern Zhejiang province have seized thousands of maps intended for export because the national borders represented did not conform to Chinese territorial claims in the South China and East China seas. Ningbo city customs authorities said the two batches of "problematic maps", numbering 23,500 in all, omitted the nine-dash line covering Beijing's vast claims in the South China Sea that extend as far as 2,000km (1,200 miles) from the Chinese mainland. The maps also failed to include contested island chains claimed by China, such as the Spratlys and the Paracels in the South China Sea, as well as the uninhabited East China Sea islands called the Diaoyus – claimed by Japan as the Senkaku.

14 August 2022: Chinese military carries out South China Sea minesweeping drill

The People's Liberation Army Navy carried out a five-day minesweeping drill in the South China Sea, the Southern Theatre Command said on Friday. The mission was conducted by a minesweeping brigade that included the Type 082-II minesweepers Hejian and Chishui, according to a statement by the PLA. It appears this is the first maritime training exercise Hejian has taken part in since it entered service. It is the fourth consecutive month that the navy carried out minesweeping drills, which would be a key task in the event of conflict in the Taiwan Strait.

29 August 2022: Aotearoa New Zealand Conducts Rare Patrol in South China Sea

A Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) P-3K2 Orion undertook a rare surveillance flight over the South China Sea last week. The Orion involved, NZ4202, is one of only three Orions

that remain in RNZAF service pending the arrival of the P-8A. During its two day-patrol (August 24th-26th) the Orion supported HMNZS Aotearoa, which was transiting the South China Sea en route to Singapore for maintenance. While the RNZAF hasn't commented on where the P-3K2 was based during the patrols, ADSB data indicates that the aircraft likely made use of Clark Air Base in the Philippines.

28 August 2022: US warships transit Taiwan Strait, first since Pelosi visit

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken assured the Philippines on Saturday that the United States would come to its defense if attacked in the South China Sea, seeking to allay concerns about the extent of the US commitment to a mutual defense treaty. In meetings in Manila dominated by discussion on simmering US-China tensions over the Taiwan visit of US House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi, Blinken said a 70-year-old defense pact with the Philippines was "ironclad." "An armed attack on Philippine armed forces, public vessels and aircraft will invoke US mutual defense commitments under that treaty," Blinken told a news conference.
