

Professor Dire TLADI Member and Chair, UN International Law Commission / Professor of International Law, University of Pretoria

Dire Tladi is a Professor of international law at the University of Pretoria. He is a member and Chair of the UN International Law Commission and its Special Rapporteur on Peremptory Norms of General International Law (*Jus Cogens*). He is also an associate member of the *Institut de Droit International*. He is formerly Principal State Law Adviser for International

Law at the Department of International Relations and Cooperation of South Africa and Legal Adviser of the South African Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York. Between 2014 and 2018 he served as Special Adviser to the South African Foreign Minister. He appeared as counsel on behalf of South Africa before the International Criminal Court in relation to South Africa's non-arrest of the Sudanese President, Omar Al Bashir. He also served as counsel on behalf of the African Union before the Appeals Chamber of the ICC in relation to Jordan's non-arrest of Al Bashir.
