

Dr Sergey Sayapin is Professor of Law at KIMEP University in Almaty, Kazakhstan. A graduate of Humboldt University of Berlin (Germany), the University of Essex (UK), and the University of World Economy and Diplomacy (Uzbekistan), he is internationally recognised for his work on international criminal law, the crime of aggression, and post-Soviet legal transformations. His recent research focuses on positioning Central Asia within global debates on postcoloniality and international legal theory, bridging TWAIL and SWAIL perspectives. He is founding editor of the Yearbook on Central Asia and International Law and holds editorial board appointments with several prominent journals in Asia and Europe. Dr Sayapin has taught and lectured across Asia, Europe, and Africa, and is committed to advancing a more pluralistic and inclusive vision of international law.
