Kevin is a barrister at Twenty Essex specialising in public international law, investment treaty arbitration, and international commercial disputes. He has acted as counsel before the International Court of Justice, International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea, Permanent Court of Arbitration, UNCLOS Annex VII tribunals and in inter-State mediation.

He is also regularly engaged on disputes involving public international law before domestic courts. These matters have involved issues relating to maritime and land boundaries, international investment law, cross-border energy trading and cooperation, climate change, law of the sea, international criminal law, human rights, treaty interpretation, and sovereign immunities.

In arbitration, Kevin acts as counsel across the full spectrum of inter-State, investor-State and commercial arbitrations. He has been engaged on matters involving ICSID, PCA, HKIAC, SIAC, LCIA, DIAC, ICC, UNCITRAL, ECT and ad hoc arbitration rules, across jurisdictions such as the United States, The Hague, Singapore, Hong Kong, United Arab Emirates, and England and Wales. In addition to his counsel work, he has also been appointed as counsel or legal advisor on international dispute settlement matters by ASEAN for the Southeast Asian States, SAARC for the South Asian States, and the Energy Community Secretariat (on its roster of arbitration experts) for the Energy Community States of the European Union.

Kevin has taught public international law, law of the sea, international investment law and arbitration at Zhejiang University, Sorbonne-Assas International Law School, University of Campania “Luigi Vanvitelli” and the National University of Singapore. He is qualified in England & Wales and Singapore, and he is also registered to appear before the DIFC and ADGM Courts of the United Arab Emirates. He holds degrees from the National University of Singapore and University of Cambridge.
