Professor Rangita de Silva de Alwis is the Distinguished Adjunct Professor of Law and Global Leadership at the University of Pennsylvania Law School and Wharton Business School. She is the Hillary Rodham Clinton Global Fellow at Georgetown Institute for Women Peace and Security, visiting faculty at the Harvard Kennedy School of Government and Senior Fellow at the Center for the Legal Profession at Harvard Law School. She is an expert on the UN treaty body to the Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) and Co- Chair of the WPS Agenda where she drafted the new international framework on Women Peace and Securitycedaw-stm-aniv-25.pdf and is the Chair of the Individual Complaints.

She is also the Gender Adviser to the President of the UN General Assembly and Vice Chair of the International Bar Association's Human Rights Institute. She has been a Visiting Fellow at Oxford and Leader in Practice at Harvard Kennedy School of Government's Women in Public Policy Program.
