



Gabrielle Marceau is a recently retired Senior Counsellor in the Research Division of the World Trade Organization (WTO) Secretariat and Honorary Professor at the Faculty of Law of the University of Geneva. She joined the GATT/WTO Secretariat in 1994 and, over more than thirty years, served in a number of legal roles, including Counsellor in the Legal Affairs Division, Legal Advisor in the Cabinet of Director-General Pascal Lamy, Acting Director and Officer in Charge of the Legal Affairs Division, and Senior Counsellor in the Economic Research and Statistics Division. From 2004 to 2025 she was Associate Professor at

the University of Geneva, and she has also served as President of the Society of International Economic Law. Professor Marceau has been a visiting professor at several universities around the world and has published extensively on WTO law and international economic law.



Nilufer Oral is Director of the Centre of International Law at the National University of Singapore. She is a member of the UN International Law Commission (ILC) and served as Chairperson of the 74th session of the ILC. She is a Co-chair of the ILC Study Group on sea-level rise in relation to international law. She is a Member of the Curatorium of The Hague Academy of International Law and is an associate member of the Institut de Droit International. She was a legal advisor and climate change negotiator for Turkish MFA (2009-2016). She is currently a Member of the Committee of Legal Experts of the Commission of Small Island States on Climate Change and International

Law (COSIS). She served a member of Council of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and was Co-Chair of the Oceans Specialist Group of the World Commission of Environmental Law. She has extensive academic publications.



Danielle Yeow is an Adjunct Senior Research Fellow at the Centre for International Law (CIL), National University of Singapore (NUS) where she on cyber law and governance as well as climate change law and policy issues. She is also an Adjunct Associate Professor in the MSc (Environmental Management Programme) at the Faculty of Law, NUS. Danielle has extensive experience as an international lawyer, including as a legal advisor at Singapore Attorney-General's Chambers. Her expertise and research interest span across all public international law, with particular emphasis on environment and climate change, trade and

investment and international security issues. Danielle is a member of the panel of arbitrators (UK-Singapore FTA), the International Law Association (ILA) Business and Human Rights Committee and a former member of the Paris Agreement Implementation and Compliance Committee.
