



Dr. Bogdan Aurescu is the first Romanian Judge at the International Court of Justice (ICJ). Prior to his swearing-in on 6 February 2024, he was a career diplomat (since 1996; with the rank of Ambassador since 2014), who served as Foreign Minister of Romania (2014-2015; 2019-2023) and as Foreign Policy Advisor to the President of Romania (2016-2019; 2023-2024).

He was member of the International Law Commission (ILC) for two mandates between 2017 and 2024, and Co-chair of the ILC Study Group on 'Sea-level rise in relation to international law' (2019-2024), as well as member of the Venice Commission of the Council of Europe (2002-2024). Professor of Public International Law at the Faculty of Law, University of Bucharest, having started his teaching activity in 1998, and editor-in-chief of the Romanian Journal of International Law. Between 2004 and 2009, Dr. Aurescu was his country's Agent before ICJ in the landmark 'Maritime Delimitation in the Black Sea' case, after being the Romania's Agent before the European Court of Human Rights (2003-2004). He is the author, co-author or editor of 19 volumes in the field of International Law, 55 chapters in books and/or contributions to international conferences, and over 225 articles, studies, comments and book reviews.
